4. Literature courses or Graduate Creative Process or Theater Arts courses. 12 Units
 Upper division/graduate (300-level and above) literature courses in English or Comparative and World Literature or Modern Languages and Literatures or Theater Arts or in other departments with the consent of the M.F.A. adviser. Graduate process courses include CW 785, 806, 810, 814, 820, 825, 840, 850, 859, 860, 866, 867, 875, 880, 881, 882, 899. Theater Arts courses include: TH A 401, 660, 705.

5. Correlative courses related to the candidate's interests and planned with the approval of the M.F.A. adviser. 12 Units
 Sequences and patterns are especially appropriate. (CW 860, along with the English Department's course in the teaching of composition, is an option in this sequence. For students planning a culminating project in playwriting, the following courses in Theatre Arts are acceptable: TH A 401, 660, 705.)
